AICCRA Course Validation and Content Sustainability Workshop

Background

Following the RUFORUM eLearning Platform (REP) upgrade and the subsequent intensive Courseware Adaptation Design exercise (13-17 October 2025), thirteen (13) high-priority courses have been successfully transformed from static documents into interactive, self-paced eLearning modules on the RUFORUM eLearning Platform. The integrity of the knowledge contained within the 13 courses is paramount. While the adaptation exercise focused on pedagogical design and standardization, this workshop ensures content fidelity and a robust learner experience. This 3-day follow-up workshop is the crucial final step in the quality assurance (QA) process. It is designed to bring the original Subject Matter Experts (SMEs) together with the instructional design and RUFORUM technical teams for a final pedagogical and technical validation. Furthermore, it includes a focused training component to empower the RUFORUM team and select SMEs to sustain and update the content going forward.

Objectives

The workshop aims to achieve the following:

- Content Validation: Obtain final sign-off from all SMEs on the accuracy and fidelity of the adapted eLearning content, verifying that the instructional design adaptation has not compromised the original subject matter.
- Pedagogical Review: Evaluate the flow, interactivity, and learner engagement mechanisms against the agreed-upon design philosophy.
- Technical Readiness: Conduct final user acceptance testing (UAT) on the REP to ensure all content and platform elements function flawlessly across devices and meet accessibility standards.
- Capacity Building: Train on performing minor content updates, managing Moodle activity types and using modern authoring tools for future content sustainability.
- Finalization: perform any minor, last-minute edits, culminating in the official validation sign-off for all 13 courses

Approach

The workshop will employ a hands-on, blended approach combining plenary design presentations,

structured small-group reviews (one SME per 3-4 courses), and practical software training sessions.

Expected outcomes and deliverables

By the end of the 3-day workshop, the project will have achieved the following deliverables:

- 13 Validated Courses confirming the accuracy and pedagogical soundness of all 13 courses.
- Consolidated Edit Action Plan: A documented list of final minor edits to be executed by the RUFORUM team within the first week of December.
- Trained Content Sustainers: Key RUFORUM staff and designated SMEs will be technically enabled to perform routine content maintenance on the REP.
- Official Launch Readiness: The 13 courses will be formally confirmed as ready for public deployment and highlighted as a major project success at the December RUFORUM AGM.
