Background

Africa has the world's youngest population and by with over 60% under the age of 25. By 2030, Sub-Saharan Africa is projected to account for over a quarter of the global population under 25, contributing more to the increase in the global workforce than all other regions combined. Consequently, it is essential for the continent to adopt strategies that would facilitate the realisation of a demographic dividend. Nurturing Africa's young talent is thus the corner stone producing a future-ready workforce for unlocking and underpinning Africa's economic and in agri-food systems transformation.

With agriculture increasingly impacted by climate change, digitalization, and globalization, traditional educational models are often misaligned with emerging labor demands, technological trends, and innovation needs in the sector (FAO, 2021). This forum focuses on how to equip Africa's youth and early-career professionals with requisite skills contemporary to todays and the emerging world of work demands. In doing so, we must pay attention to increasing the number of women in science and its leadership; enhancing work and business transitions for young people; implementing transformative education systems that skill for the 21st century work force. Bridging the gaps between research, extension, and industry is critical. Stronger partnerships between universities, agribusinesses, and rural development institutions promote technology adoption and ensure that training programs align to evolving world-of-work. Moreover, developing inclusive skilling strategies that intentionally target women and rural youth can address persistent inequalities in access to productive resources, finance, and decision-making platforms (IFAD, 2021). Ultimately, investing in a skilled, adaptable, and empowered agricultural workforce will not only increase productivity and incomes but also create dignified employment, reduce rural poverty, and drive Africa's broader economic transformation. This session of the conference aims to explore these issues focusing on:

- Explore opportunities for more inclusive education that rebalances the human resource pyramid by strengthening university TVET education.
- Inform creation of policies that effectively translate research findings into actionable practices that benefit society and promote environmental sustainability.
