#### **Background**

To create sustainably functioning African agricultural research and innovation ecosystems that produce products and services for transforming Africa's agrifood systems, the African Development Bank (AfDB), African Union Commission (AUC), One-CGIAR, Forum for Agricultural Research in Africa (FARA), the African Forum for Agricultural Advisory Services (AFAAS), the Regional Universities Forum for Capacity Building in Agriculture (RUFORUM), the Sub-Regional Research Organisations (SROs ) committed to collective actions under the framework of the Abidjan II Communiqué Action Plan .

In April this year, all the partners signed a Memorandum of Understanding to form the African Agricultural Research, Innovation and Education Institutions (AARIEIs) partnerships. The meeting also aligned the objectives of Abidjan II Action Plan, and the CGIAR Portfolio 25 to the CAADP-Kampala Declaration (2026 -2035). The CAADP-Kampala Declaration focuses on Building Resilient and Sustainable Agrifood Systems in Africa. This Side Event aims to provide a platform for the AARIEIs, the CGIAR, National Agricultural Research Organizations (NAROs), policymakers and development partners to discuss practical pathways for taking forward the momentum created so far for operationalizing their partnership through and the Abidjan II Action Plan to contribute to the CAADP Strategy Action Plan 2026-2035.

#### **Purpose**

The side event aims to fast tract the operationalization of the Abidjan II Action Plan to support the implementation of the refreshed CAADP Strategy Action Plan by reviewing and ageing on quick wins and actionable areas. It will also seeks to engage key partners for buy-in.

#### **Objectives**

- Introduce the AARIEIs as the vehicle for operationalizing Abidjan II Action Plan the Kampala CAADP declaration and the CGIAR Research Portfolio 2025.
- 2. Discuss the operationalization modalities of the AARIEIs to implement the Abidjan II Action Plan in support of CAADP goals.
- Discuss pathways to leverage expertise and resources to support operationalization of the AARIEIs, the Abidjan II Action Plan.

- Pathways to leverage expertise and resources to support operationalization of the AARIEIs, and the Abidjan II Action Plan discussed and identified
- 4. Next Steps identified and agreed upon.

This meeting will be held in plenary, in the sidelines of the RUFORUM 21st AGM as a closed session. Keynote presentations followed by panel discussions and plenary discussions will shed light on the focus issues of the meeting. A drafting team will meet prior to the meeting to generate the workshop discussion documents
